





# HOW TO DRAW A NEO TRADITIONAL ROSE WITH STEVE KERR.



# NEO TRAD ROSE BY STEVE KERR



## STEP 1:

DRAW TWO CIRCLES, ONE INSIDE THE OTHER. BIT LIKE AN EGG. THESE WILL SERVE AS BOUNDARIES FOR YOUR INNER AND OUTER PETALS.

BREAK UP THE MIDDLE CIRCLE WITH THESE 4 LINE FROM BOTTOM TO TOP. THESE WILL BECOME PETAL FOLDS WHICH WILL SERVE AS A TRANSITION FROM THE INNER TO OUTER PETALS.



## STEP 2:

LET'S ADD THE UNDERSIDE TO OUR FOLDS. AS WE'RE LEANING INTO A NEO TRADITIONAL STYLE WE CAN MAKE THE POINTS A BIT SHARPER AND CURVES A BIT BOUNCIER.

I ALMOST TREAT THE FOLDS LIKE BROWS, MOUSTACHE/LIPS. IT HELPS ADD CHARACTER.



## STEP 3:

TO FINISH THE BOUNDARIES OF THE INNER PETALS WE NEED TO TRACE JUST OUTSIDE THE CENTRE CIRCLE TO CLOSE THE UNDERSIDE OF THE BUD. IT KEEPS IT CIRCULAR BUT ASYMMETRIC.

TO CLOSE THE TOP WE ADD THREE TINY PETALS IN THE SHAPE OF A WOBBLY M. MAKE SURE TO STAGGER THE LAYERS TO CREATE DEPTH.



## STEP 4:

TO FINISH THE INSIDE OF THE ROSE BUD WE NEED TO ADD A SKIN GAP THE WHOLE WAY AROUND. THIS WILL INSURE WE KEEP EVERYTHING SEPARATE AND READABLE.



# NEO TRAD ROSE BY STEVE KERR



**STEP 5:**  
STARTING FROM THE BOTTOM AND WORKING YOUR WAY UP. ADD 5 PETALS WITH A SKIN GAP.

WITH THIS ROSE I'VE DECIDED THE RULE FOR THE PETALS ARE:



**STEP 6:**  
GIVE THE PETALS DIRECTION AND DEPTH BY ADDING FOLD LINES THROUGH THE PETALS. USE THE V SHAPES WE'VE CREATED AS STARTING POINT THEN SHAPE A LINE TOWARDS WHERE THEY WOULD MEET THE BUD.



**STEP 7:**  
I LIKE TO ADD AT LEAST A COUPLE LEAVES COMING FROM THE ROSE, AS IF YOU'RE LOOKING DOWN AT IT. START BY ADDING THE MIDDLE FOLD OF THE LEAF.



**STEP 8:**  
THE RULE FOR THE UNDERSIDE OF THE LEAF IS A SHARPER POINT-BOUNCE WHILST AIMING FOR THE BOTTOM OF THE LEAF FOLD.

FOR THE FAR SIDE OF THE LEAF DO A  
SINGLE BOUNCE.






STEP 10:  
STARTING AT THE BOTTOM OF THE  
LEAF TOUCHING THE PETALS, IN  
ONE MOTION, ADD TEXTURE LINES  
THROUGH BOTH SIDES OF THE LEAF  
TO SHAPE IT.




STEP 11:  
ADD ANOTHER LEAF, FOLLOW STEPS  
7 - 10 IF YOU NEED ANY HELP.







# How to draw A Japanese Chrysanthemum




Step 1: draw 3 circle, one central, one around and then one larger slightly lower and then add a curved line through the centre to make the petal layers and stem.

Step 2: I like to start with the outer layers of petals incase I want any to overlap the other layers, for this I draw a curved line with a small circle at the end, use pencil as these will be erased later, each line starts from the bottom of the centre circle and out to the or passed the last circle.




Step 3: Same shapes again but staying within the second circle now, this gives you the flow for your next layer of petals, you are able to place them where you like, you just want to avoid the ends of the petals over lapping each other for later.

Step 4: Next is the central bud, which you want to use the same shape for the petals as before but build them into a circle creating a enclosed shape for the petals to branch out from.





# How to draw A Japanese Chrysanthemum




Step 5: This step is small, here you do little finger shapes in the centre of the bud which is the stamen of the flower

Step 6: Mark out the stem but following the initial line you made for it and adding a second line beside it to give the stem a bit of thickness and structure; wide enough that it looks like it could hold the weight of the flower head, if the flower is bigger, the stem will be bigger too.



Step 7: Now the main structure is done I like to get rid of the circles from the start to see the full flow of the petals .

Step 8: Now it's time to line the flower starting with the centre start with an oval in the middle of the bud and then following the shapes from earlier going around the small circle me down the curved line, this is the outside of each petal in the bud, as they curve to the back they get slightly smaller until the back petals become circles only.



Imagine the curve is here  
Do not draw this in.



Step 9: This is the tricky bit so I have included extra steps for this process... here you need to draw each petal from the outside line and into the circle but stop the circle short of connecting, then you want to do a small line to indicate the inside of the petal, and another line to show the other end of the inside.




Step 10: Once you have drawn the middle and second layer of petals, you can continue on to the last row, this will be a little bigger but still using the same shape as before.
















Step 11: Draw the centre stamen, the little finger shapes, and line the stem making sure the lines for it do not go through the petals.

Step 12: You can now erase any pencil lines and you'll have a finished chrysanthemum ready to colour and/or add leaves to if you wish. I have included a fully coloured version at the start to show what it can look like, but you can do your own thing, that's half the fun.









# HOW TO DRAW A TRADITIONAL ROSE




STEP 1.  
DRAW A CIRCLE, AND THEN DRAW A SMALLER CIRCLE IN THE CENTRE OF IT

STEP 2.  
DRAW A LINE SEGMENTING THE BOTTOM THIRD OF THE CIRCLE, AND THEN DRAW A “Y SHAPE” ABOVE IT

STEP 3.  
ON EACH OF THESE LINES DRAW TWO ARCS, MEETING AT THE MIDDLE OF THE LINE TO CREATE THE PETAL FOLDS.

STEP 4.  
CONNECT THE FOLDS USING TWO ARCS JUST INSIDE THE ORIGINAL CIRCLE, TO SHAPE THE ROSE




**STEP 5.**  
ADD TWO LINES IN THE MIDDLE OF  
THE BUD

**STEP 6.**  
IN BETWEEN THESE TWO LINES  
DRAW A WIDE “C SHAPE” AND  
CONNECT THEM TO EACH FOLD TO  
MAKE THE CENTRE SHAPE

**STEP 7.**  
DRAW IN ADDITIONAL FOLDS TO  
SHAPE THE TOP OF THE ROSE BUD

**STEP 8.**  
ADD IN 3 MORE ARCS WITHIN THE  
ORIGINAL CIRCLE TO FINISH UP THE  
CENTRE OF THE ROSE



### STEP 12.

FROM THOSE POINTS, ADD A LEAF SHAPE WITH THE POINT IN LINE WITH THE END OF THE TRIANGLE. ADD IN SEMICIRCLES CONNECTING EACH POINT UP TO MAKE VEINS.



### STEP 13.




ERASE ANY UNNEEDED LINES AND GO OVER THE DESIGN WITH A PEN, RESHAPING ANY PARTS THAT YOU WANT TO BE THICKER OR THINNER

SHADING AND COLOUR  
ADD BLACK INTO ANYWHERE WHERE A LEAF OR PETAL WOULD BE ON TOP OF OR OVERLAPPING ANOTHER. THEN ADD IN COLOUR, ENSURING A CLEAR GAP TOWARDS ANY OUTSIDE EDGES





